#### **ADVENT GOSPELS**

On the four Sundays of Advent, the Catholic lectionary presents a series of Gospel readings that prepare for the celebration of the Birth of Christ. The Sunday Advent readings all rotate on a three year cycle, but they always follow the same pattern. The Gospel for the First Sunday of Advent always tells of the reign of Christ at the end of time. It echoes the theme of the previous Sunday, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Advent starts with the message that we await the Second Coming of Christ. This entire season is not just a reminder of a past birth but also an anticipation of future glory. The Second and Third Sundays of Advent always have Gospel readings about John the Baptist. John is an adult in these passages, proclaiming the nearness of the Kingdom of God and serving as the prophet who bridges the Old and New Testaments. John foreshadows Jesus in his birth, his preaching, and his death. John's message on these two middle Sundays of this season inspires us to follow Christ. The Fourth Sunday of Advent always tells part of the story that just precedes the Birth of Christ. These familiar episodes set the stage for one of the Bible's best-known passages, the story of Christmas. The Gospel readings of the four Sundays of Advent come to us in reverse chronology. We start with the end of time. We continue to the period when Jesus was an adult. We end in the days before his birth. Like a funnel, Advent opens with a giant theme, the grandness of Christ the King, and it ends with a specific one, the child lying in a Bethlehem manger.







# Advent Wreath

The Advent Wreath is a beloved Christian tradition that helps us mark the four weeks of Advent as we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. Its circular shape symbolizes God's unending love; the evergreen branches remind us of hope and life; and the four candles—one lit each week—invite us to watch, pray, and grow in joyful expectation. As the light increases week by week, we are reminded that Christ, the Light of the World, draws near to dispel darkness and bring peace.

#### Simple Directions to Make an Advent Wreath

Use a round base (foam, wire, or grapevine) and cover it with fresh or artificial evergreen branches, securing them with floral wire or hot glue. Place four candle holders evenly around the wreath—traditionally three purple candles and one rose candle for the Third Sunday of Advent. Add simple decorations if you wish, such as pinecones or small ribbons, keeping the design prayerful and safe. Set the wreath on a stable surface, light one candle each week of Advent, and pray with your family as you wait in hope for Christ's coming.

When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another member of the family.

All make the Sign of the Cross.

Leader: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

All respond: Who made heaven and earth.

God's Word

Then the Scripture is read: (choose one)

Isaiah 9: (verses 1-2 and 5-6) Isaiah 63 (verses 16-17 & 19)

Isaiah 64 (verses 2-7)

At the end, the reader says: The word of the Lord.

And all respond: Thanks be to God.

Prayer

Leader: Lord our God,

we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us,

he is the Savior of every nation.

Lord God,

let your blessing come upon us

as we light the candles of this wreath.

May the wreath and its light

be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.

May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The blessing may conclude with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel":

O come, desire of nations, bind in one the hearts of humankind; bid ev'ry sad division cease and be thyself our Prince of peace. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

#### **Suggested Prayer for Each Week while Lighting the Candles**

Begin each week 's prayer with:

All make the Sign of the Cross.

Leader: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

All respond: Who made heaven and earth.

#### Second Week of Advent (Two purple candles are lighted)

Leader: Lord God, as we light this second candle, open our hearts to receive your Son. Stir in us a deeper longing for your presence, that we may notice the gentle signs of your coming throughout our days.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### Third Week of Advent (Two purple and the rose candle are lighted)

Leader: Lord God, as we light this third candle, make us ready for the coming of Christ.

Strengthen our hope and steady our steps, that we may recognize your nearness even in simple, hidden moments.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### Fourth Week of Advent (all four candles are lighted)

Leader: Lord God, as we light this fourth candle, prepare us to welcome Jesus with renewed hearts. Awaken in us a spirit of wonder and generosity, trusting that you are guiding us even when the path is dim. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.


