IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

"The Immaculate Conception" is a title for Mary, the mother of Jesus. The expression means that Mary was conceived without sin. The conviction that Jesus was born of a virgin is a distinct belief, even though many Catholics erroneously think that the Immaculate Conception refers to Jesus. Contributing to the confusion is the celebration of the Immaculate Conception during the season of Advent. While the faithful are preparing to honor the birth of Jesus, we commemorate the conception of Mary. The choice of December 8 for the Immaculate Conception does not directly relate to Advent; it corresponds more to the traditional date for the Feast of the Birth of Mary, September 8, which coincides with the dedication of a Jerusalem church in honor of the mother of Mary. The feast for the conception of Mary is backed up from that day nine months. In a similar way, we celebrate the Annunciation on March 25, nine months before the birth of Jesus. Belief in the Immaculate Conception asserts that God preserved Mary from all sin from the moment of her conception, thus preparing a pure vessel for the Incarnation of the Son. This belief is not expressly contained in the Scriptures, but it enjoys a wide spread following in the Church's tradition. Although the Immaculate Conception of Mary has been affirmed since the earliest centuries of Christianity, it was not formally proclaimed a dogma of the Church until 1854. December 8 is now a holyday of obligation in the United States, which is placed under Mary's patronage with this title. When Mary is depicted as the Immaculate Conception, she is often shown wearing a crown of stars as the woman in Revelation 12 and standing on a snake, reversing the temptation of Eve. Mary, the Immaculate Conception, is the exalted Queen of Heaven who manifests God's power over sin.

Celebración de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe Domingo, 14 de diciembre

MISA DEL TERCER DOMINGO DE ADVIENTO CON LA PROCESIÓN CON LA IMAGEN Y MÚSICA EN HONOR A LA VIRGEN A LAS 12:30 (EN ESPAÑOL) FIESTA DESPUÉS DE LA MISA

Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe-Virgin of Guadalupe

A los 53 años de edad Juan Diego tuvo la aparición milagrosa que daría inicio a la devoción a la Virgen de Guadalupe en México. La historia fue así: Juan Diego vivía con su tío Juan Bernardino en Tulpetac, lugar donde no había iglesias por lo cual tenían que ir a misa hasta la Santa Cruz de Tlatelolco.

El sábado 9 de diciembre de 1531 Juan Diego se encaminaba hacia ahí y al pasar por el cerro del Tepeyac oyó un canto que no era de esta tierra. Se detuvo a gozar de él y cuando miró arriba vio un sol resplandeciente y en medio a una señora en actitud de oración, él fue a saludarla y ella le dijo que era su deseo que le construyese un templo en ese llano y le encomendó también que le comunicara ese deseo al señor obispo.

El obsipo, Juan de Zumárraga, no lo tomó en serio y le pidió que volviese otra vez al lugar a ver si sus ojos no lo habían traicionado. Regresó desconsolado Juan Diego y la Santísima Virgen se le apareció otra vez para decirle que volviera el domingo a ver al señor obispo. Así lo hizo Juan Diego, pero el obispo le pidió una señal comprobatoria de la voluntad de la Virgen. La señora se le apareció de nuevo y le pidió que volviera al día siguiente.

El lunes, día de la cita, se enfermó de cuidado el tío Juan Bernardino y hasta el martes pudo salir Juan Diego que se dirigió la ciudad a buscar a un sacerdote, eludiendo el encuentro con la Virgen, para que le administrara los últimos sacramentos. Iba por ahí, ese día 12 de diciembre, cuando al pasar de nuevo por el Tepeyac se le volvió a aparecer la Virgen y le preguntó qué le pasaba. Él le contó lo de la enfermedad de su tío y ella le dijo que no se preocupara porque su tío ya estaba sano, después le pidió que subiera al cerro a recoger unas flores.

Fue Juan Diego y en efecto encontró muy bellas rosas de las que no era temporada y que nunca se habían dado allí. Ya con ellas en su ayate, la Santísima Virgen dijo que las llevara donde el señor obispo pero que no desplegase su ayate ni lo mostrara a nadie más. Así lo hizo Juan Diego.

Después de conseguir entrar en el obispado, le dijo a Zumárraga, el obispo, que ahí le llevaba la prueba que le había pedido. En ese momento soltó su ayate y apareció en él pintada como por los ángeles, la imagen de la Virgen de Guadalupe.

On December 9, 1531, a 57-year-old Aztec, Juan Diego, saw the Blessed Mother on a hill in Mexico City. She told Juan to have a church built in her honor. When Juan went to ask Bishop Zumarraga about this, the bishop did not understand the Indian dialect—and he did not believe in the vision Juan described.

Three days later, on December 12, Mary appeared again to Juan Diego, and this time she gave him a sign for the bishop. "Take these roses to the bishop," she said, as she arranged in his cloak beautiful roses she had Juan Diego pick from the hillside although it was winter. When he was admitted into the bishop's room, Juan Diego opened his cloak, and out dropped the roses. On the cloak there remained an image of Mary as she had appeared to Juan Diego.

The image of Mary on the cloak is known as Our Lady of Guadalupe for an interesting reason. On that same day, Mary appeared to Juan's uncle and cured him, giving him a message for the bishop, saying that she would "crush the serpent's head." The bishop did not understand the Indians' language. The Indian word for "crush the serpent" sounded to him like "Guadalupe," the name of Mary's shrine in Spain. Thinking that the Virgin wanted the new shrine to have the same name, the bishop called her Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Mary appeared to Juan Diego dressed as an Aztec woman to show her love and compassion to an oppressed group of people. Mary had heard the prayers and pain of these people, and she came to give them hope.


Mary's visit to Guadalupe is a reminder that God will remember his mercy for all people. In Mary's song of joy, the Magnificat, she praised God because he has put down the mighty, exalted the lowly, filled the hungry, and sent the rich away empty. People honor Our Lady of Guadalupe because they recognize her motherly concern for them.
